



APCR Scholarship Instructions & Eligibility Criteria

Eligibility Criteria

To be considered for this scholarship, Program Coordinator applicants:

- Must be a current member of the Association of Program Coordinators in Radiology (APCR).
- Must not receive financial support from their program to attend the annual meeting.
- Must not have been a recipient of this scholarship within the past two years.
- Must submit application with signed endorsement from their Program Director or Department Chair.

Application Instructions

Submit your completed application and all required documents via email to rsmcdow@emory.edu by **October 30, 2026**. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered. The Scholarship Committee will review all submissions and, with approval from the APCR Board of Directors, will **notify awardees** by November 13, 2026.

Required Documents Checklist

- Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- Headshot or Professional Photo
- Personal Statement: Explain why you're applying, what you hope to gain from the annual meeting, your professional goals, how this will have impact on your program and your involvement with APCR (e.g., committees or projects).

Award Information

- Up to two in-person scholarships will be awarded, each covering up to \$2,000 in expenses for the annual AAR meeting.
- Scholarship recipients must attend all APCR sessions, including both business meetings.
- If the recipient receives alternate funding after being awarded the scholarship, the award must be declined so it may be given to another eligible coordinator.
- Confirmed presenters must secure separate funding prior to committing to present. Presentation status is not considered during the selection process to ensure fairness and equity.
- Note: Reimbursement is not available for meals provided at the conference (e.g., breakfast). Refer to GSA per diem rates for the meeting location: <https://www.gsa.gov/travel/plan-book/per-diem-rates>
