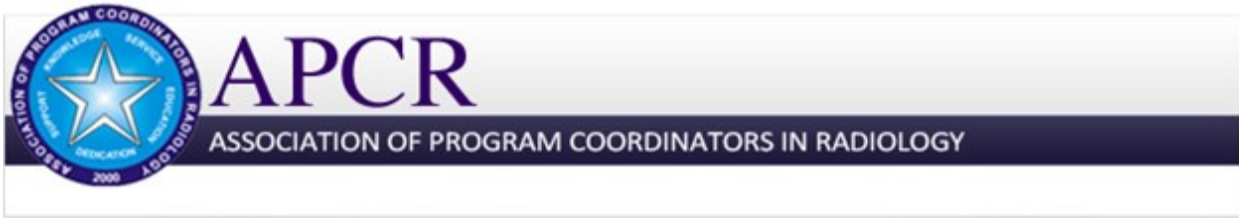

I. Call to Order – Angela Huff

Angela Huff, President, called the 25th Annual APCR member meeting to order at 1:15 PM PST.

II. Approval of April 2, 2024, Member Meeting Minutes – Angela Huff

Angela referred members to the previously distributed agenda and meeting materials. A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously approved to accept the 2024 meeting minutes.

III. President’s Report – Angela Huff

2024-2025 Year in Review

The President’s report and committee reports were distributed via email and were included in the meeting packet. Angela welcomed members to the 25th Anniversary Celebration and reviewed the past year’s accomplishments. Angela highlighted the educational webinars offered to coordinators, emphasizing their role in ongoing engagement and professional development. Members interested in presenting at future events were encouraged to reach out.

IV. President-Elect Report – Amanda Hicks

Amanda reflected on a week of collaboration and innovation, acknowledging past presidents and committee members who served as moderators or presenters. Amanda emphasized the success of the breakfast roundtable and the importance of committee involvement, encouraging members to attend the afternoon’s committee meetings and reception. Amanda expressed enthusiasm for the continued growth and contributions of program coordinators.

V. Treasurer Report – Ranitta McDowell

Ranitta reported that in celebration of the 25th anniversary, \$25,000 was allocated and fully utilized. APCR remains financially sound, with over \$128,000 in net assets. Members were directed to the meeting packet for full financial details. A motion to approve the financial statement was made and passed.

VI. Presentation of Old Business – Angela Huff

Angela reviewed updates from the past year, including bylaw revisions that separated the Secretary and Treasurer roles for better workload management. Updates were also made to the IR/DR and Archives Committees.

VII. Presentation of New Business – Angela Huff

Angela noted the board’s intent to propose bylaw amendments creating Social Media and Survey subcommittees under the Electronic Communications Committee. Due to incomplete materials, the vote was deferred. Members will receive updates via APDR communications.

VIII. Nominations – Sheik Amin

On behalf of the Nominating Committee, Sheik presented the following slate of officers:

- APCR Outstanding Coordinator Award: Presented to Samantha Schnitzer for her innovation, leadership, and dedication to radiology education
- APDR Award of Program Coordinator Excellence: Angela Huff was named the inaugural recipient, with remarks by Dr. Jim Anderson and Dr. Ryan Peterson
- President’s Certificate of Appreciation: Given to Angela Huff for her outstanding service
- Amanda Hicks presented Angela with a plaque recognizing her contributions as outgoing president

X. Introduction and Installment of 2025-2026 President – Angela Huff and Amanda Hicks

Angela passed the gavel to Amanda Hicks, who was formally welcomed as the new APCR President.

XI. 2025-2026 President Member Giveaway – Amanda Hicks

Amanda announced a member giveaway, highlighting contributions from the Membership Committee and donors, including the Medical College of Wisconsin. Prizes included gift cards and other giveaways.

XII. New Member and New Attendee Welcome – Angela Huff, Bridgette Flaherty, Co-Chairs, and Amanda Hicks, President

Angela introduced Bridget Flaherty as Co-Chair of the Membership Committee. Bridget reported 13 new members, each of whom received a certificate. On behalf of the Membership Committee, Chair Angela Huff welcomed new members who joined, and Amanda shared that membership grew by about 50 members, bringing the total to over 200.

I. Call to Order – Amanda Hicks

Amanda Hicks called the 25th Annual APCR Member Meeting to order at 8:04 AM PST. Attendees were welcomed, invited to enjoy refreshments sponsored by RSNA, and encouraged to sign the APCR banner for post-meeting group photos and take-home giveaway items.

II. RSNA Presentation – Jaclyn Kelly

Jaclyn Kelly, Sr. Director, Customer Service, thanked coordinators for their critical support in radiology education. Jaclyn highlighted the RSNA's resources for residents, including access to journals (Radiology, RadioGraphics), online learning tools, peer-reviewed cases, and core exam prep materials. Coordinators were reminded to help enroll incoming residents for free membership and to update contact details by emailing customerservice@rsna.org. She also promoted RSNA's AI Imaging Certificate Course and a discounted \$95 member-in-training rate for the annual meeting. Feedback and suggestions were welcomed.

III. Committee Reports – Committee Chairs

Awards – Tina Hunter & Sheori Sinegal, Co-chairs

Coordinators will receive nomination requests for the APCR Outstanding Coordinator Award. A new award, the APDR Award of Program Coordinator Excellence, allows nominations from Program Directors, Residents, or Chairs. The committee welcomed a new member and expressed appreciation to all contributors.

Electronic Communications – Amanda Hicks, Chair

Amanda shared the committee's growth and expanded responsibilities, including managing the website, social media, newsletters, webinars, and technology support during meetings. Missi Varner was announced as co-chair, with Amanda mentoring her in preparation for leadership transition. Members were reminded to check emails from APDR and reach out via apcradiology@gmail.com.

Archives – LaToya Wright, Chair

LaToya discussed efforts to maintain resources via Basecamp and the website. Members were encouraged to upload photos to the Whova app for archival use. Future plans include updating the website to highlight new awards and scholarship recipients and creating a GME Professionals Day slideshow. Appreciation was extended to contributors of the 25th-anniversary presentation.

Social Media – Missi Varner, Chair

The committee continues to actively post on Facebook, X, LinkedIn, and Instagram, with plans to explore new platforms like TikTok, YouTube, and Threads. The focus remains on building community, sharing resources, and supporting coordinator development.

Surveys – Melinda Parangan-Chu, Chair

Melinda outlined the subcommittee's support for surveys targeting coordinators and stakeholders. These

include pre- and post-meeting surveys, and a September survey focused on roles, responsibilities, and workload. Members were encouraged to engage and watch for emails sent via APDR.

Fellowship – Allendice Young, Co-chair

Amanda introduced Allendice as co-chair, joining Sheik. The committee is focusing on best practices for fellowship coordination, CCC processes, and NST milestones. New members were welcomed, and participation was encouraged.

IR Programs – Ranitta McDowell & Samantha Schnitzer, Co-chairs

The committee will address recent updates around ESIR, ABR pathways, and IR program developments. With strong participation and new members, the committee continues to be an inclusive resource for all IR program types.

Membership – Angela Huff & Bridget Flaherty, Co-chairs

Membership has grown to 220, with 41 new members since the last meeting. Efforts to identify new members via ACGME data were shared, and outreach to fellowship programs will be improved. The committee offers digital welcome packets and is developing a survey to better understand new members' needs. Long-term member recognition is under consideration.

Mentorship – Melissa Laity, Chair

The committee remains active in supporting the Foundations Course and meet-and-greet events. New mentors and mentees are always welcome.

Professional Development – Susan Lamey, Chair

Susan shared updates on planning for the Fall newsletter and professional development series, expected in October. A survey will collect input on key topics. The committee is seeking additional members and presenters for the Foundations Course. Planning has also begun for next year's welcome reception and Coordinator Lunch.

Scholarship – Ranitta McDowell, Chair

Ranitta congratulated 2024 scholarship recipients Jessica and Harmony and encouraged members to read their testimonials on the website. The committee is working to archive past recipients and will open 2025 applications in September for the 2026 AAR meeting in Atlanta.

Wellness – Melinda Parangan-Chu, Chair

Melinda highlighted ongoing initiatives like "Wellness Wednesdays," breathing exercises, and the year-long Wellness Bingo challenge. The winners Margo and Marlene were recognized. APCR Liaison Report: Fall 2025

Dear RSNA, Affinity Groups, and Leadership,

The Association of Program Coordinators in Radiology (APCR) is pleased to present our Fall 2025 update, highlighting our ongoing commitment to professional development, member wellness, and collaborative innovation as we look ahead to AAR 2026.

Professional Development & Webinars:

This year, APCR expanded its educational programming with a series of webinars designed to address the evolving needs of program coordinators. Thalamus provided a webinar highlighting major updates to their recruitment platform. Our Foundation Course series continued this year, with presenters providing guidance on essential tips, important deadlines, and useful strategies for navigating the upcoming quarterly tasks. Other webinars offered to our membership included topics such as “Things I Didn’t Know to Ask” and the upcoming “Professional Development Opportunities and Career Paths for the Program Coordinator: Choose Your Own Adventure.” These sessions have been well received and continue to foster growth and engagement within our community.

Wellness Initiatives:

Recognizing the importance of emotional well-being, our Wellness committee launched an eight-month wellness challenge. Members have access to recorded sessions, handouts, and resources focused on managing stress, building resilience, regulating emotions, cultivating a positive attitude and gratitude, and developing a growth mindset. This initiative underscores our commitment to supporting the holistic health of our members.

AAR 2026 Planning:

Preparations for the AAR 2026 conference in Atlanta are well underway. Highlights include:

- À la carte roundtable talks led by volunteer facilitators, covering a range of hot topics.
- Interactive APCR-only sessions focused on empowering confidence, overcoming imposter syndrome, and strengthening communication across residency programs.
- Collaborative APDR/APCR sessions addressing ACGME RRC updates, ABR updates, and guidance for international trainees.
- Member meetings and committee meetings structured to maximize engagement and participation.
- Special events such as the APCR Past Presidents Lunch and the APCR luncheon.
- Partnership with the Arts & Humanities special interest group, led by Missi Varner, including an Affirmation Tree

Program Listing & Timeline Projects:

In partnership with the APDR, APCR helped develop custom timetables of important tasks/duties for Diagnostic Radiology, Interventional Radiology, and Fellowship programs, detailing program-specific

activities. Additionally, an APCR committee project is underway to provide highly detailed, committee-specific timelines and specification of duties, further supporting coordinators in their committee roles.

Governance Updates:

- The APCR Bylaws have been reviewed and updated, with unanimous approval from the APCR Board of Directors. Next steps include submission to APDR, member notification, and a final vote at a virtual meeting or at AAR.
- Board of Directors role write-ups are being collected, with returning board members and alternates contributing summaries to clarify responsibilities and support leadership transitions.
- Committee Chair write-ups are being collected as well, outlining the role and responsibilities of these leadership positions.

Committee Updates

Awards Co-Chairs: Tina Hunter & Sheori Sinegal

The Awards Committee had an exciting year celebrating excellence and innovation within APCR. At the 2025 AAR Conference, APCR proudly recognized Samantha Schnitzer, Education Programs Director at The Ohio State University, with the Outstanding Coordinator Award, presented on behalf of APCR and Don Hatley for AIRP. A poster honoring Samantha will be displayed at the 2026 AAR Conference.

In collaboration with APDR, the committee also introduced the Coordinator Award of Excellence, a new honor recognizing coordinators who demonstrate exceptional dedication, effectiveness, and leadership in graduate medical education or radiology. Nominations were open to program directors, department chairs, residents, and fellow coordinators. The inaugural recipient was Angela Huff from Emory University, whose poster will also be featured at the 2026 AAR Conference.

Additionally, the committee launched the 25th Anniversary Appreciation Awards at AAR 2025 as an inclusive way to recognize and appreciate APCR members—a tradition that will continue annually as part of our ongoing recognition efforts.

Electronic Communications Co-Chair: Amanda Hicks & Missi Varner

The Electronic Communications Committee had an outstanding year, playing a key role in APCR's 25th Anniversary celebration at AAR 2025. A highlight was the creation of a commemorative slideshow that ran throughout the week at our vendor booth, earning enthusiastic feedback from attendees.

Other notable achievements include enhancements to the APCR website—such as updating the News & Updates section on the homepage to improve visibility and member engagement. The committee also ensured timely communications across multiple social media platforms, promoting webinars, sharing important notices, and celebrating GME Professionals Day with coordinated messages to our membership.

Looking ahead, the committee plans to explore innovative strategies to expand member engagement, including the development of an APCR podcast to showcase committee initiatives and highlight member contributions.

Archives Subcommittee Chair: LaToya Wright

The Archives Committee had a productive year focused on preserving APCR's history and enhancing member engagement. Key accomplishments include:

- Migrating historical documents and files from Google Drive to Basecamp, creating a centralized and organized repository.
- Developing a commemorative slideshow celebrating APCR's 25th anniversary and honoring contributors.
- Showcasing the AAR meeting through the Whova App with photos and daily recaps, providing timely updates and highlights.

- Beginning preparations for the 2026 APCR presentation, which will be featured during the Welcome Reception as a visual reflection of each AAR meeting year, capturing memorable moments and APCR's participation.

Looking ahead, the committee plans to update the APCR website to improve navigation, integrate social media, and expand the history section to preserve and showcase APCR's legacy. Additional initiatives include highlighting new award and scholarship recipients online and creating a slideshow for GME Professionals Day.

Social Media Subcommittee Chair: Missi Varner

This year, the Social Media Subcommittee made significant strides in strengthening APCR's digital presence. Highlights include the successful launch of both Threads and BlueSky accounts, expanding our reach and engagement opportunities. The team also maintained consistent posting across Facebook, Instagram, Threads, and other platforms to spotlight APCR events and member achievements, supported by visually branded content.

Looking ahead, the committee remains focused on overcoming the challenge of balancing timely, engaging content across multiple platforms—especially during busy recruitment and conference seasons. Key initiatives for the upcoming year include:

- Refining cross-platform posting schedules to ensure consistent, strategic promotion of APCR-sponsored events.
- Enhancing branded visuals for upcoming activities to boost engagement.
- Developing platform-specific strategies for Threads and BlueSky, with a goal of at least two posts per month per platform.
- Leveraging analytics—including impressions, shares, clicks, and follower growth—to guide future content decisions.

Through these efforts, the subcommittee aims to deliver a cohesive, data-driven social media strategy that amplifies APCR's voice and connects meaningfully with its audience.

Survey Subcommittee Chair: Melinda Parangan-Chu

This year, the Survey Subcommittee was a huge support in helping gather feedback from our members. Some of the projects the survey committee was responsible for included:

- Helping create and administer the pre-AAR APCR meeting sessions survey to gather questions from our members for APCR educational sessions
- Helping create and administering QR codes to be hosted at the end of each APCR educational session to gather feedback and questions from the audience to provide to the speakers. From these responses a report was provided to the APCR President for review.

The Survey Subcommittee is looking forward to assisting with the surveys for the 2026 APCR sessions at the AAR meeting.

Fellowship Co-Chairs: Sheik Amin & Allendice Young

The Fellowship Subcommittee had a highly collaborative and impactful year, focusing on education, resource sharing, and addressing evolving program needs. Key achievements include:

- Hosting an ACGME-led presentation on Non-Standard Training (NST), providing valuable insights for fellowship coordinators.
- Doubling committee membership and strengthening collaboration through active email discussions to share best practices and address challenges.
- Facilitating cross-institutional conversations to identify gaps in NST program monitoring and evaluation, while increasing awareness of inconsistencies in program requirements and trainee support resources.

Challenges remain around standardization of NST monitoring, milestone alignment, and institutional variability in visa processing and Academic Enrichment Fund (AEF) usage. These issues highlight the need for unified guidelines to ensure consistency and fairness across programs.

Looking ahead, the committee plans to:

- Present at the Foundations Course to engage new members and share fellowship-specific insights.
- Invite expert speakers on Alternate Pathway best practices and visa processes.
- Continue evaluating NST structures to develop standardized approaches for trainee monitoring and assessment.
- Explore strategies for managing visas and AEF funds transparently.
- Implement a Fellowship Timeline and host open forums to address resource needs and emerging challenges.
- Build a collaborative partnership with the APDR Fellowship Chair to align goals and strengthen communication.

Through these initiatives, the Fellowship Subcommittee aims to enhance program development, promote consistency, and support coordinators in navigating complex processes.

IR Programs Co-Chairs: Ranitta McDowell & Samantha Schnitzer

The IR Programs committee had an active and productive year, advancing initiatives to support both Interventional Radiology (IR) and Diagnostic Radiology (DR) program coordinators. Key accomplishments include:

- Launching quarterly meetings focused on accreditation, recruitment, case logs, and virtual resources.
- Completing a hot topics survey to guide discussions on ESIR/ABR alternate pathways, duty hours, and ACGME updates.

- Sharing best practices through tutorials, including a step-by-step guide on using Thalamus.
- Presenting at AAR 2025, with Co-Chair Ranitta McDowell delivering “*IR: Implementation, Integration...SOAP?*” and committee member Alexis Reynolds preparing for “*Breaking Down Silos: Strengthening Communication Across Interdependent Residency Programs*” at the upcoming AAR conference.

The committee also emphasized collaboration by building a shared folder of resources and preparing an IR-specific program timeline (July–June) for distribution to all APCR members.

Looking ahead, priorities include:

- Continuing quarterly meetings on recruitment trends, alternate pathways, and board certification.
- Expanding resources on the SharePoint site.
- Supporting discussions around ACGME patient encounter logging, graduation budget strategies, and interview day preparations.
- Hosting roundtable discussions at AAR 2026, led by Co-Chair Samantha Schnitzer, to strengthen communication and share innovative strategies.

Through these efforts, the IR Programs Subcommittee aims to provide coordinators with practical tools, foster collaboration, and address evolving program needs.

Membership Co-Chairs: Bridget Flaherty & Angela Huff

The Membership Subcommittee had an exceptional year focused on strengthening engagement, celebrating milestones, and welcoming new members. At the AAR 73rd Annual Meeting in Los Angeles, the committee elevated the member experience with creative touches for APCR’s 25th Anniversary, including over 100 appreciation gift bags filled with commemorative items and themed surprises. 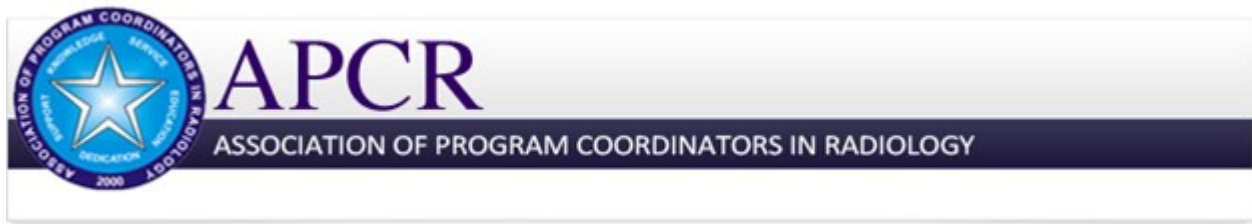
