COMMITTEE REPORTS

Annual Survey Committee Update

The APDR Survey Committee is charged with developing and disseminating the annual membership survey. Results of this survey inform program directors of residency and fellowship programs and provide benchmarks for programs that strive to meet ACGME requirements. Members can find the prior surveys with results on the APDR website and these survey results can serve as a resource to inform local policies and programming. The 2025 survey will be sent to all members in January/February 2025. Topics that will be included in the survey span a wide array of subjects, including the current state of program signaling in resident recruitment, program support for trainees to present at national conferences, distribution of overnight call responsibilities of DR and IR trainees, impact of oral boards on residency education, the role of advanced practice providers in resident education, and program director wellness. We hope that every residency program director will fill out the survey. A high participation rate provides all programs, small or large, with useful data to guide future direction in residency training.

Education Committee Update

The primary focus of the Education Committee for the past 2 years has been to write Rotation Guides for radiology residents that cover all subspecialities. These are intended to provide guidance on how to prepare for rotations and what resources are considered most high yield for improving medical knowledge and understanding while on rotation. There are 2 or 3 guides for each subspecialty based on level of training. These guides contain recommended targets for case volumes, suggested reading material and videos for each week on rotation, mid-rotation and end-of-rotation feedback sections, and a "must-see diagnosis" checklist with hyperlinks to case examples. Our committee is pleased to report that all the Guides have been completed and are available on our website. There is link available for users to provide feedback which will be reviewed twice per year."

Membership Committee Update
